We invite scholars, researchers, and practitioners to submit original research articles and shorter snapshots for *Anthropology in Action's* overarching theme of Anthropology at the Frontiers. We are especially interested in critical engagements that challenge and update our notion of what it means to be human in the 2020s, such as digital transformations, including coexisting with non-human technology and ethical queries around AI, queer perspectives on temporalities and kinship, rethinking the role of traditional media and complicity in global violence, moral cosmologies and digital media, racial justice, reparation, and abolition, labor and automation, as well as new critiques on ecological sustainability discourses- including 'green hushing' and the covert harm of circular economies. In short, we aim to highlight how anthropology is applied at the cutting edge of societal transformations to open a forum for scholars, practitioners, and creative thinkers who engage with ethnographic methods.

At *Anthropology in Action*, we value public anthropological engagement with non-traditional formats. Therefore, we also welcome shorter pieces that grapple with media content and popular culture (nonfiction, fiction, podcasts, film, television shows, etc.) that shape contemporary social relations today.

SUBMISSIONS

We particularly encourage completed works with a fast turnaround within the 2025 publication calendar.
